EPIPHANY SEASON

We are now in the Epiphany Season of the Church year. "Epiphany" is a Greek word meaning "appearing" or "revealing"—the revelation of God through the birth of His son to all the nations of the world. It begins on the day of Epiphany which is January 6, a date set to commemorate the arriving of the Wise Men from the East. Since they followed the light of the star, these people from other nations create themes seen in Epiphany of Light, Star, and outreach to all Nations.

The first and last weeks of this season are marked with white paraments for significant days in Jesus' life—Baptism and the Transfiguration. Otherwise, green banners and drapes indicate the season until Lent begins on March 2 with Ash Wednesday. — Liturgical Arts

Asylum-Seekers Needs

Asylum-seekers are those fleeing violence and persecution, applying through the courts for protection in the US. They are following all the rules and are here legally, living with sponsors, usually close family members.

The goal of this program is to assist asylum-seekers to journey safely home, as well as assist those asylum-seekers who live in the Phoenix area with basic needs while their claims are being adjudicated. Seeking asylum is a legal right under federal law. We have always had asylum seekers in our community, and they are vulnerable while their court cases are being decided.

Listed below are the items requested for donation with links provided for purchasing clothing items through Amazon.

All donated items may be dropped off in a box labeled "Asylum-Seekers Needs" located in the church narthex. Email Dave Gilkey at 2gilks@gmail.com with any questions.

These items will go to recently released asylum-seekers. They travel for up to 3 days to their destination in the U.S. All items are non-perishable.

Snack Packs

A one gallon "ziplock" bag containing an assortment of snacks. Here are some ideas: cereal, crackers, granola bars, protein bars, poptarts, Uncrustables, jerky, individual chicken/tuna packs, raisins, nuts, juice boxes, Gatorade, water bottle, apples/oranges ONLY as they last longer...etc.

New underwear

- Men's underwear (sizes: med, lg)
- Women's underwear (sizes: 6, 7, 8)
- Bras (sizes: 34B, 34C, 36B, 36C)
- Boy's underwear (sizes s, m, lg)
- Girl's underwear (sizes 6, 8, 10)

New socks

- Men's socks (shoe sizes: 6-12)
- ➤ Women's socks (shoe sizes: 5-9)
- Kid's socks (shoe sizes: 2-9)

Other

- New Men's T-shirts (sizes: M, L)
- CLEAN AND GENTLY USED: jeans, baby clothing, and sneakers (all sizes and ages)
- > Baby wipes and Diapers (all sizes)



After having adapted the school lunch program in 2021 (in response to restrictions in Honduras), *Lunches for Learning* has two very clear priorities for 2022.

First, resume the daily school lunch program at all 46 schools.

We Remain Focused

Since the COVID-19 pandemic hit Honduras in March 2020, the impact of the economic shutdown has caused the poverty in Honduras to worsen.

Even more families now find themselves living in abject poverty ... meaning that they typically have \$2 or less available each day to feed their families.

This means that the need for the L4L school lunch program is greater than ever right now. Generosity from our supporters has allowed L4L to adapt our program to meet the need in 2021, and now we have our hearts set on reaching into even more Honduran communities that need our help in 2022.

The Impact of Your Generosity:

- A gift of \$150 provides school lunches to one child for an entire school year.
- \$750 feeds a single grade-level grouping of children (ex: 3rd graders, averaging 5-6 students).
- \$1,500 covers the cost of lunches for an entire classroom (multiple grade-level groups).
- \$2,500 will sponsor a kindergarten or a small K-6 school for a full year.
- \$5,000 will sponsor a medium sized K-6 school for a full year.
- \$10,000 will sponsor a large K-6 school for a full year.
- \$20,000 will sponsor a large K-9 school for a full year.


