


Exploring Your Spiritual Gifts Retreat

So come join us on this adventure of discernment and answer the questions you have been asking yourself. All are welcome!



Please remember our congregation continues to deposit books and magazines in the Book Drive basket in the narthex throughout the year.




LIVING WATER'S "HUNGER JARS"




Prayer of the Week






