



LIVING WATER'S "HUNGER JAR"

The large Hunger Jar is located in the sanctuary during services, to the right of the water fountain. Offerings placed in the Hunger Jar are typically distributed 50/50 to local and international/global hunger organizations or iniatives.

The Service and Caring Ministry Team at LWLC periodically determines how we distribute offerings to the Hunger Jar. Most recently, we split the 12/31/22 balance of \$884 to Vista del Camino food shelf in Scottsdale and to the Food for Kidz event in Fountain Hills (see related Connections article). In the past, Hunger Jar offerings have been split and sent to ELCA World Hunger, Vista del Camino, St. Mary's Food Bank and Feed My Starving Children.

You are invited to make an offering to the Hunger Jar while the offering is being collected during the worship service. While the jar's tag line says "Change for Change," your offering can be coins, bills or even checks! And if you prefer, you can donate through LWLC's online donation option and indicate "Hunger Jar."

From time to time, you may also see smaller Hunger Jar collection jars elsewhere in the church as we gather for worship. Each offering placed in the Hunger Jar is a reminder that our hungry neighbors, near and far, benefit from our generosity. Thank you!

Provided below is current construction information on the upcoming construction schedule, but please remember
schedules can be impacted by a variety of factors to include weather, materials scheduling, availability of resources, and coordination with others.

Pima / Happy Valley Intersection:

A detour of Happy Valley Road (east of Pima Road) is currently in place shifting the Pima Road/Happy Valley Road intersection slightly to the south, with a temporary traffic signal in place to manage traffic at the intersection. Happy Valley Road is currently closed on the west side of Pima Road. This traffic configuration will remain in effect until late 2023.

Access remains open to Pinnacle Presbyterian Church at Pima Road and at Happy Valley Road arriving from and departing to the west only (to/from Scottsdale Road). Travelers should not try to use the church parking lot to cut through and avoid the closure as the parking lot is divided so there is no direct access between Pima Road and Happy Valley Road.

Crews continue work on the east side Pima Road at the closed Happy Valley intersection to construct several box culverts as part of the drainage improvements.

Scheduled to begin the week of March 13, concrete crews will work on curb and catch basins on the east side of the intersection and the future Happy Valley median island on the east side of the intersection.

Scheduled to begin the week of March 20, electric crews will install new traffic signal pole foundations.

Pima Road:

Pima Road traffic is shifted to the west side of Pima Road, striped for two lanes in each direction, as crews work to construct the east side of the new Pima Road. In addition, Chama and DeLaO are closed to traffic on the west side of Pima Road.

Crews are working on the east side of Pima Road to install the first half of box culverts crossing under Pima Road, and also storm drain pipe, and catch basins as part of the drainage improvements.

Scheduled to begin the week of March 27, concrete crews will begin work forming and pouring curb and sidewalk along the east side of Pima Road.

Contractor crews for Southwest Gas are currently relocating their facilities on the west side of Pima Road during daytime hours with a southbound lane restricted for this work, which is expected to be complete for this segment by the end of next week.

Crews are nearing completion working on concrete curb, ADA ramps, sidewalk, and landscaping at La Mirada Shopping Center. The south driveway remains closed and should be reopened by end of March.

Happy Valley Road:

Happy Valley Road traffic is being maintained with one lane in each direction, currently shifted to the north from Pima Road to Golf Club Drive, and shifted to the south from Golf Club Drive to Alma School Road.

Scheduled for Monday, March 13, paving crews will remove a layer of asphalt and repave the area from 101st Place to 102nd Street for a smoother driving surface.

Pipeline crews continue installation of water pipeline in the north side of Happy Valley Road moving west from Alma School Road. This work is currently scheduled to cross 101st Place the week of March 27. This work will be conducted one-half at a time to maintain access with a flagger in place, if needed, to assist in managing traffic while work takes place. This work will tentatively cross Golf Club Drive sometime around the end of April. Electric crews are currently working to install electric conduit on the south side of Happy Valley Road, from Pima Road working in an easterly direction toward Golf Club Drive. As this work crosses side streets or driveways, crews will work to maintain access; however, there may be short periods where access is restricted.

APS contractor crews are working on the north side of Happy Valley, east of 101st PI, and Southwest Gas contractor crews are currently working on the south side of Happy Valley, west of 92nd St, to relocate their respective facilities, behind existing traffic control.

Crews continue work installing conduit across Happy Valley Road at several crossings. To better accommodate traffic during daytime hours, this work is taking place during night hours when needed, from 7 p.m. to 4 a.m. Sunday through Thursday nights, with a flagger in place to assist in managing traffic near the work zone. This work should be complete by the end of March.

During construction, business and resident access will be maintained, although there may be times wherein it will not be the most direct route, so please allow extra time for your travel during construction. Thank you for your patience during construction.

Join us in collecting items for Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief's "A Season of Hope"

Once again, we will collect items for Lutheran World Relief's (LWR) Personal Care Kits as part of LWR's "A Season of Hope" during Lent. Our collection begins on Sunday, March 5 and ends on April 2.



Cleanliness may not actually be next to

godliness, but it certainly helps a person feel more human. When families find their homes destroyed, or must flee for their safety, soap and a towel rarely make the cut for what they can carry. Arriving in a refugee camp or other place of safety, they are scared, vulnerable and dirty from the travel. The simple items included in a Personal Care Kit provide much-needed self-care, critical germ fighting, and the chance to regain dignity amidst situations of fear and uncertainty.

We can give hope through these 5 items:

- · 2-3 bars of soap, totaling 8 or 9 oz., in original wrapping
- a new lightweight bath towel, minimum size 20"x40" and maximum 52" x 27", dark color preferred. Bath towels should be light or medium weight (no heavy, fluffy towels, please) and the preferred size is 52" x 27". It should NOT be a hand towel. Dark colors are requested by LWR. Lightweight bath towels are easier for recipients to handwash and air dry, take less storage space, and are less expensive than the fluffy towels we might enjoy.
- . 1 toothbrush, in its original wrapping**
- 1 wide-toothed comb (not a pocket comb) and
- . 1 metal nail clipper, with or without a nail file attached

We ask that you bring in the items for a complete kit if you can. There is a collection bin in the church entryway.

Once again we've requested financial support from a Thrivent Action Team Grant to help us fill out needed items. Last year, through your generosity and the help from Thrivent, we were able to assemble 125 Personal Care Kits. Can we do it again? Thank you for your support!


