A Message from Pastor Shari



Three weeks prior to VBS, there was a bit of melancholy in the air. You see, the number of registrations we received was lower than expected, but it wasn't due to lack of effort. We had been planning and preparing for months with promotions, designing and constructing a set, coming up with ideas for crafts, recipes, games, bible stories, songs, designing and ordering t-shirts, preparing for a book drive, applying for Thrivent grants, recruiting and equipping

volunteers, creating audio visual accompaniment to our opening and closing celebrations, and ensuring that we would have a safe and welcoming environment for the kids. To say the least, it is definitely a lot of work to prepare for the type of high quality VBS program that Living Water provides, but it's also a labor of love. And, it is not that we were sad because of how hard we had worked, but we had just hoped that we would have the opportunity to bless more kids with this experience.

But that wasn't the end of the story, because by the time VBS started, we had 10 more kids! But, that's not all God provided. In fact, God blessed us in so many ways. Friendships were formed among volunteers, intergenerational connections were made, youth and young adult volunteers felt a sense of purpose in the church, the kids made wonderful memories at church and felt loved and special, and everyone was blessed by the Holy Spirit present in this place and in each other. God definitely blew all of our expectations out of the water and provided exactly what we needed.

The moral of the story is that we must not doubt what God can do, even when the patterns of this world tempt us into thinking our efforts are in vain, or when we feel defeated. We must press on, seeking God's will and opening our eyes to see God's amazing work all around us.

I give thanks for our VBS Director, Kris Crow, and our faithful VBS leadership team, who never waivered in their commitment. And thank you to everyone who said "yes" to sharing their time and unique gifts that God gave them to make this the best VBS program around!

Living Water's office fish suggests a cents-able way to lighten a hefty wallet

Q. Who benefits from contributions to the Hunger Jar?

A. Living Water's Hunger Jar has been a godsend for starving children and adults for a couple decades. This ministry originated with encouraging parishioners to help alleviate hunger locally and around the world by dropping coins into a jar. This simple collection of loose change was initially called Change for Change. About ten years ago it was re-named the Hunger Jar, perhaps to better define its focus on fighting hunger.

The jar, which sits in the front of the sanctuary near the fountain, is emptied following Sunday worship. After a few months, the Service and Caring Mission Groups select two hunger organizations to receive funds. These disbursements are split 50/50 local and global. Last February, \$884 was divided between Vista del Camino Food Bank in Scottsdale and Food for Kidz, an organization that targets food insecurity across the U.S. and around the world). A second disbursement last month provided a total of \$775.50 split between ELCA World Hunger and St. Mary's Food Bank, which provides food throughout Arizona. If we use St. Mary's "5 meals per \$1" formula, so far this year LWLC's Hunger Jar has already fed nearly 8,300 hungry people. Wow! (Sadly, inflation has significantly decreased St. Mary's previous yield of 7 meals per \$1.)

Your kind gifts of small change produce a tremendous change for hungry children and adults in Arizona as well as countries around the world. Additional organizations receiving funds in previous years include ELCA Lutheran Disaster Relief, Feed My Starving Children, Grace Lutheran Church pancake breakfast for the homeless in central Phoenix, Lunches 4 Learning (a program for elementary school children in Honduras), Lutheran Disaster Response

Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission Christian School

Here is another AZ Tax credit opportunity. This is through the Arizona Christian School Tuition Organization (ACSTO). One of the schools helped by this tax credit is the **Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission Christian** school in Rock Point. This school needs financial help. You donate right to ACSTO and specifically designate the Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission Christian school. Donors can give up to \$1245/\$623 (married/single) towards the original tax credit. Any donation above this amount will then go towards the Overflow Tax Credit, up to a maximum of an additional \$1238/\$620. It is clearly explained at the ACSTO website which is http://acsto.org. They walk you through the donation process right there on the website. The website also provides the tax reporting instructions and documents needed if you participate in this unique tax credit opportunity.

Eastern Europe Crisis Response

The Situation:

On Feb. 24, Russian forces invaded Ukraine, launching land, sea and air attacks. Russia has launched air strikes across the country, including on the capital of Kyiv and other major cities. Millions of people fleeing the violence of Russia's war against Ukraine and are moving toward Ukraine's western districts and such neighboring countries as Poland, Moldova, Slovakia, Romania and Hungary. There are major humanitarian concerns for both internally displaced people and refugees. Many of these Ukrainians fleeing their homes need shelter and such basic necessities as food, water and toiletries. Care for people also includes pastoral and psychological support to address the trauma they've endured.

Our Response:

Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland, Romania and Slovakia, as well as such ecumenical partners as this Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis created by Russia's war against Ukraine. These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton has joined other religious leaders from Europe and around the globe in issuing an interfaith call for peace in the region.


