A Message from Pastor Shari



Have you heard about our new campaign at Living Water? It's called "God at Work" and it's an opportunity to tune our eyes and ears to what God is doing in our communities.

You see, it's easy to notice that God is at work in our church. We have so many wonderful ministries that are clearly inspired by God's word, the Holy Spirit and our love for each other. We have Bible Studies, Vacation Bible School, Note Writing, Angel Tree, Lutheran World Relief

Health Kits and Quilts, Choir, Praise Band, Liturgical Arts, Altar Guild, the Sunday morning Servant Team, Saints and Sinners, and the list goes on and on.

The question is, however: where do you see God at work in the community *surrounding* our church? Where do you see good things happening? Where do you see hope and love? Where do you see unexpected or extraordinary things?

Do you see people volunteering in unique places? Do you notice a particular store employee who seems to really care about the customers or a customer that really cares about the employees?

Have you been driving by an animal shelter or food pantry or organization for years and haven't stopped? Maybe this is a chance to stop and learn more about what they do and how they help others, or maybe just check out their website.

Have you been saying "hi" to a particular neighbor for months, and haven't really learned anything about them? Maybe it's time to learn a little more about them. You never know, they might be doing extraordinary things in the community.

A friend of mine has been driving down the same road on Sunday mornings for years, and for the last couple of months, she has noticed that the same five people have been picking up trash on the same ½ mile stretch every single Sunday. My friend learned from the cashier at AJ's Fine Foods that these dedicated trash picker-uppers come into the store for a cup of coffee and a muffin when they complete the job every single Sunday. It would have been easy for my friend to just drive by and not even notice, but she did, and she learned a little more about these strangers who were making a difference in their community (and she even paid for their coffee).

Stories like this one remind us that God is active in big and small ways all around us, and we all need these reminders. So, we would like to encourage you to start tuning your eyes and ears to these types of things, and let us know what you see and hear! Living Water's office fish asks Youth Mission Trip participants to share more about their time in Niagara Falls, NY

Q. The Youth Mission Trip presentation in late August piqued my interest, especially the service days. Can you find out more about how this experience impacted the youth?

A. The YMT schedule included four service days. The first worksite was Niagara Heritage of Hope and Service, a not-for-profit group that purchased the Holy Trinity Roman Catholic Church complex in 2009. Marg, the president of this group, made quite an impression on the youth. She also put them to work for two days. They spent their other two days at Community Missions of Niagara Frontier, which also addresses community needs. The youths' experiences at these worksites and other interaction during the week affected them in the following ways.

"The most meaningful moment for me was helping out the youth with their relationships with God and just being there for them as a guide."

"I learned that not everyone is as fortunate as we are. Part of the reason I like volunteering and going on these mission trips is that I know when we participate in doing the service work, we are making a difference, and we are helping others in the ways that we can!"

"I think my most meaningful moment during the service days was on the first day, getting a tour of historic Holy Trinity. In just that time I felt immediately more connected to the community and the owner Marg. It truly showed us how much the church meant to Marg and made our service work mean that much more."

"My most meaningful moment was while we were helping with the service work, I realized that it takes a village to truly understand that the reason all of us are helping out is because we are doing it for the greater good!!"

"I liked when we finished weeding at Holy Trinity and at the end, we saw how much work we'd done. I felt like we accomplished a lot."

"During the evening activities we learned a lot about the history of Niagara Falls and how prior to Covid it was highly populated, and tourism was booming. It was interesting to see a small community rebuilding itself after times of despair."

Church Council met by Zoom yesterday, Monday, September 18, to discuss an agenda ranging from Living Water's "Stewardship for All Seasons" campaign, to safety and security considerations to the Thanksgiving Food Drive to 2024's ELCA Youth Gathering. Living Water's dedicated volunteers make a huge difference in the range and depth of what we can and do accomplish. Thank you!

Denny Dumler joined the meeting to fill us in on the progress being made by the Living Water team involved with "Stewardship for All Seasons." Very soon the team will be presenting information and ideas to the congregation concerning opportunities to support Living Water and its missions.

Living Water will have a new sign in front! Pastor Mark has been working to facilitate the design and installation of the new sign. Once a new design has been formally created, Council will review the design and make suggestions for changes or give the go-ahead. We are looking forward to a sign that is more visible and easier to read.

Steve Umland and Ron Ophaug, Living Water's Property Manager, will schedule an on-site visit in October with the City of Scottsdale to evaluate Living Water's water usage both inside and outside.



Our volunteers make tremendous difference.






MAY THE MEMORIES OF OUR LOVED ONES FILL US WITH COMFORT AND JOY

Congratulations to our very own Living Water Member, Myrna Wells-Ulland, Grand Canyon Synod, Region 9, who was elected executive board president during the Twelfth Triennial Convention of Women of the ELCA.



More than 251 Women of the ELCA voting members worshiped together, conducted business and elected new officers and churchwide executive board members during the Twelfth Triennial Convention, Sept. 18-21, in Phoenix, Arizona.

The voting body elected Myrna Wells-Ulland, Phoenix, Arizona (Grand Canyon Synodical Women's Organization), as president.

"Women of the ELCA is a wonderful organization," said Myrna Wells-Ulland, elected on the fourth ballot as the organization's president for the 2023-2026 triennium. "I love the things we do [and] all of the initiatives we have. I know they are challenging... I am really excited about the capabilities we have for this next triennium. [In Hebrew], hineni means 'Here I am, Lord. You called me. Use me. So I'm going to close with that. Hineni."

Officers and churchwide executive board members will serve the 2023-26 term. It was the first time the convention had met in person in six years, after many changes wrought by the pandemic. As executive director Linda Post Bushkofsky told voting members in her report, "Few things remain the same... The pandemic and all that it brought caused us to focus, with laser precision, on what really matters. It caused us to try different ways of being together in community."

Far from taking its last breath, the Women of the ELCA is evolving, changing and being transformed, Post Bushkofsky said. "Does a dying organization launch a \$1 million campaign, expand its hospitality to those in the margins or recommit to its anti-racism work? Does a dying organization embrace online learning and worship in new and diverse ways? No. ... The Holy Spirit is pushing and pulling us forward. Some of us are jumping on board, moving into that future. [Others] of us won't be making that journey, resisting the reality of where we are going. But the good news is, that the journey has begun. ... We are a big, beautiful, flawed community, created in the image of God, [living] as disciples of Jesus."

Please bring your own water, sodas and ice. This year we are also asking attendees to bring a potluck dish. Bring your favorite Vegetable, Salad or Dessert to share.



Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission Christian School

Here is another AZ Tax credit opportunity. This is through the Arizona Christian School Tuition Organization (ACSTO). One of the schools helped by this tax credit is the **Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission Christian** school in Rock Point. This school needs financial help. You donate right to ACSTO and specifically designate the Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission Christian school. Donors can give up to \$1245/\$623 (married/single) towards the original tax credit. Any donation above this amount will then go towards the Overflow Tax Credit, up to a maximum of an additional \$1238/\$620. It is clearly explained at the ACSTO website which is http://acsto.org. They walk you through the donation process right there on the website. The website also provides the tax reporting instructions and documents needed if you participate in this unique tax credit opportunity.
