A Message from Pastor Mark

It used to be that a display of manners by an individual was simply an act of common courtesy. Those same courtesies are still part of our world today, but unfortunately, they do not seem so common anymore. The terms "please" and "thank you" are ones that were ingrained into my very being at a very early age. In fact, I cannot remember life prior to knowing and using those two words.

Now don't get me wrong, I doubt very much that they were part of the natural progression of my life. The use of such words was instilled into me – albeit at times with vigor – by my family. You were nothing, if not polite. I too find myself doing the same sort of thing. I have coaxed, pleaded, forced, and insisted that my children use those two words whenever appropriate. And they do – at least when I am around – but even at times on their own, I hope.

"Thank you" is an integral part of the life of the Christian. It is in our words and expressions of thanks that we acknowledge the abundance and the magnitude of all that God has done for us. Unfortunately, even in our relationship with God, the whole idea of offering thanks is no longer a common act. While God's generosity has not changed, nor has it diminished, our acknowledgement of what God does for us seems to have dissipated. We simply do not take the time we need to offer the necessary "thank you."

November is our month of thanksgiving. For Living Water Church, it is the time (Stewardship Appeal Sunday is on November 19) for which we consecrate our gifts to God for the upcoming year. In our country it is also our time to offer thanks. Some 200 plus years ago, George Washington suggested the date November 26 as Thanksgiving Day. Then in 1863, at the end of a long and bloody civil war, Abraham Lincoln asked all Americans to set aside the last Thursday in November as a day of thanksgiving. Are we as a society so poor at showing our gratitude that we have to set a day aside to do so? I would think not, but we always run the risk of taking certain things for granted. When something is part of our everyday lives, we can fall into the trap of taking it for granted – we simply assume it is always going to be there.

Bottom line is this – as Christians – as those who have been truly blessed – we need to live everyday of our lives as Thanksgiving Day. We are to share ourselves with the people around us. We are to open our hearts and our homes to our family, friends, and neighbors. We are to share the gifts that God has given us – our gifts of time, talent, and treasure. We need to give back to God for those things that have been first shared with us. When we give back to God in a way that not only shows our gratitude, but also works to improve the quality of the lives of people around us, then we are living our lives in a manner fitting for the faithful. For it is in the sharing that we truly can find joy – a joy that can only come from God. In the end, perhaps, that is why we find so much joy when we gather on the fourth Thursday of the month. In the end, that is why we need to take the time and make the effort to ensure that we offer to God an ongoing offering of thanks. Thanksgiving Day allows us the moment to offer our thanks for the gift of this country in which we live. Our Stewardship Appeal Sunday allows us the opportunity to give our thanks to God in a very tangible and regular way for all our blessings. Our Thanksgiving Worship on Tuesday, November 22 reminds us of to whom we are to be thankful toward, for our country, our family and friends, for our lives, in fact for all we are and all we have we give thanks to God.

So, to help us out, we have a single holiday to remind us to do so – our National Day of Thanksgiving. And ever year, the President of the United States of America reminds us that we need to take the time to offer thanks for what we have received. And for us at Living Water we set aside a single Sunday - Appeal Sunday - where we pledge to offer to God, in a tangible way, our thanks for the blessings of our lives. In a way it is a shame that we have distilled our pledge of thanks down to a single day, yet it is a very good thing that we do have these days before us.

As we gather wherever we might, to give thanks on that special Thursday, let us not forget that this is not an annual event that takes place, but rather a reminder of a daily happening that needs to be part of all of our lives. As we get ready to celebrate Thanksgiving, let us do so, by daily offering our thanks to the God who has given us life, not to mention the means to celebrate this wonderful day.

Living Water's office fish gives a "fins up" to getting involved

Q. I've never been in a congregation as busy as Living Water. So much gets done here, especially all the ways we help people who are less fortunate. What gives?

A. What gives is parishioners with a strong desire to serve, pastors who are receptive to new ideas, and a well-organized framework for smoothly carrying out an array of Mission Program Groups. This framework consists of more than 60 teams that are divided into 7 different Mission Program Groups: Caring, Fellowship, Giving, Learning, Service, Witness, and Worship and Music.

Each group has a designated Mission Program Leader. Pastor Mark, for example, oversees the Worship and Music Mission Program Group, which includes the Altar Guild, Choir, Liturgical Arts, Praise Band, Servant Teams, and 6 other teams. Each Mission Program Group also has a Church Council contact.

The Mission Program Groups vary in size. The Giving Mission Program Group, for instance, consists of the Annual Stewardship Drive, Finance, Endowment Fund, and 3 other teams. Our Service Mission Program Group is considerably larger. It includes the Angel Tree, ELCA Good Gifts, LWLC Book Drive, Grace Pancake Breakfast, and more than a dozen other teams.

Living Water's outpouring of activity wouldn't be possible without members of our congregation who have stepped up to serve as Team Leaders and Team Members. As they know, becoming part of one or more of Living Water's 60-plus teams is a win-win proposition: Your efforts make a difference for others, and you benefit from getting to know fellow parishioners as you work alongside each other.

As the end of this year approaches, consider getting involved in a team in 2024. Living Water offers many opportunities to be part of its well-organized framework. La Sagrada Familia Lutheran Food Shelf Needs Our Help!



You donate right to ACSTO and specifically designate the Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission Christian school. Donors can give up to \$1245/\$623 (married/single) towards the original tax credit. Any donation above this amount will then go towards the Overflow Tax Credit, up to a maximum of an additional \$1238/\$620. It is clearly explained at the ACSTO website which is http://acsto.org. They walk you through the donation process right there on the website. The website also provides the tax reporting instructions and documents needed if you participate in this unique tax credit opportunity.



The Adult Forum at 9:00am on Sunday, October 29, will feature Geoff Caldwell speaking on "The Joy of Charitable Giving."

Specifically, Mr. Caldwell will explain and answer questions relating to minimum distribution, trusts and all that is involved in charitable giving.
