Men's Breakfast Bible Study

Pastor Mark has been leading this Thursday morning Bible study for almost a decade. The group meets weekly at 8:00 a.m. at Spirit in the Desert Retreat Center. Breakfast is available for \$7. Attendance averages 15+, mostly members of our congregation but not limited to them. The sessions focus on reflecting on and studying the lessons for the upcoming Sunday worship. Tuesday Women's Study

Myrna Ulland leads this Tuesday mornings Bible study. It meets at 10:00 a.m. in Living Water's Fellowship Hall. Attendance varies from 8-16 participants. Study topics range from video-based series to Bible studies published in the Women of the ELCA's Gather magazine and occasional book-based studies. To quote Myrna, "We grow in our knowledge of scripture and in friendship and support with the depth of the prayers and conversations that occurs each week." Zoom is an option if you're unable to attend in person.

Dennis Nelson Bible Study

Retired Pastor Dennis Nelson provides a weekly online Bible study that focuses on scripture lessons for the upcoming Sunday. Church Council Highlights December 2023

Church Council met at Mark and Tracy Rossman's home for the December meeting and for a Christmas celebration. We all appreciated the hospitality and the time it gave us for conversation and fellowship.

"Stewardship for All Seasons" is wrapping up its work. In order to craft a realistic budget for 2024, the stewardship team will follow up with those who have not yet pledged so that the finance team can understand as fully as possible what financial resources Living Water will have to work with. Thank you to all who give of your time, talents, and treasures to fulfill the mission of Living Water.

Steve Umland and Ron Ophaug met with representatives from the City of Scottsdale and received their expertise on how we might save on our water usage inside the church buildings. There are several "fixes" we can pursue to decrease our water usage and to save money. Ron Ophaug is looking into upgrading equipment in restrooms and readjusting water levels to prevent excess water use. The Council will discuss recommendations for outside water savings in a meeting early in 2024.

Living Water's new sign is complete and on display in front of the church! Pastor Mark oversaw the specifics of the creation and installation of the sign.

The Council agreed wholeheartedly that the Christmas Cantata was a rousing success! We are very grateful to Christina Hall for providing Living Water with an inspiring and uplifting addition to the Christmas season.

Pastor Shari, working with the Northeast Valley Consortium, reported that Rev. Dr. Colleen Windham-Hughes, from California Lutheran University, will be speaking at Living Water on April 13. Her focus will be on working with those experiencing loneliness.

Living Water is in the beginning stages of planning a Blood Drive through the American Red Cross for Spring 2024 or 2025. Pastor Shari will have more information as the details are worked out.





Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission Christian School

Here is another AZ Tax credit opportunity. This is through the Arizona Christian School Tuition Organization (ACSTO). One of the schools helped by this tax credit is the **Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission Christian** school in Rock Point. This school needs financial help. You donate right to ACSTO and specifically designate the Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission Christian school. Donors can give up to \$1245/\$623 (married/single) towards the original tax credit. Any donation above this amount will then go towards the Overflow Tax Credit, up to a maximum of an additional \$1238/\$620. It is clearly explained at the ACSTO website which is http://acsto.org. They walk you through the donation process right there on the website. The website also provides the tax reporting instructions and documents needed if you participate in this unique tax credit opportunity.

November is the month when the Honduran school year ends and graduations are celebrated. Just a few weeks ago, we hosted several groups of school sponsors who traveled with us to Honduras to celebrate at the schools which are supported by their sponsorship commitments.

While graduations in the US typically occur in May, rather than November, graduation is a highly-anticipated rite of passage for students in the US, and a time when graduates are contemplating what they might accomplish in the next phase of life. The idea of <u>not</u> reaching graduation – for American students – is unheard of.

In Honduras, however, far too many children never have the opportunity to reach graduation. For the more than 1 million children in Honduras who have completely fallen out of the school system, dreaming about tomorrow is replaced with a focus on how to survive today. When you have no food, tomorrow is much less important than finding a way to feed yourself today.

The children attending L4L-sponsored schools are able to dream about tomorrow ... because of you. The L4L school lunch program has kept them in school and they are able to celebrate graduation with a great deal of pride in what they have accomplished. They have hope for a better future ... because of you.



You are helping these Honduran children achieve the graduation milestone they probably could never have dreamed of without your help. We cannot thank you enough, but we plan to keep trying.



Students in L4L-sponsored schools enjoy a healthy lunch each day, provided through the support we receive from our sponsors and donors. Each lunch includes rice, beans, tortillas, a glass of milk and a chewable multi-vitamin which provides vitamins A, C, D, E, B1, B2, B6 and B12, as well as Niacin, Folic Acid, and Iron.


For many of these children, the lunch they receive at school is the only meal they will receive on any given day ... and the daily lunch is what is keeping these kids in school; allowing them to complete their education and graduate.





Lunches for Learning exists with one targeted goal –
to break the cycle of poverty in rural Honduras.
In a region where up to 30% of children
drop-out of school each year to find food,
and more than 70% live below poverty level,
Lunches for Learning is making a difference.

Instead of dropping out of school to work ... or beg ... or search for food, kids are remaining in school, on their way to becoming literate adults who are employable in the Honduran economy; able to support themselves and their families; breaking a multi-generational cycle of poverty.
