
### Note regarding giving checks:

### **Medical Lending Library Ministry**


What: It's the same as a book library but lends durable medical equipment.

### Personal Care Kits for LWR Feb 18 – March 24, 2024

### Join us in collecting items for Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief

Once again, we will collect items for Lutheran World Relief's (LWR) Personal Care Kits as part of LWR's "A Season of Hope" during Lent. Our collection begins on Sunday, February 18 and ends on Palm Sunday, March 24.

Cleanliness may not actually be next to godliness, but it certainly helps a



person feel more human. When families find their homes destroyed, or must flee for their safety, soap and a towel rarely make the cut for what they can carry. Arriving in a refugee camp or other place of safety, they are scared, vulnerable and dirty from the travel. The simple items included in a Personal Care Kit provide much-needed self-care, critical germ fighting, and the chance to regain dignity amidst situations of fear and uncertainty.

We can give hope through these 5 items:

- · 2-3 bars of soap, totaling 8 or 9 oz., in original wrapping
- a new lightweight bath towel, minimum size 20"x40" and maximum 52" x 27", dark
  color preferred. Bath towels should be light or medium weight (no heavy, fluffy towels,
  please) and the preferred size is 52" x 27". It should NOT be a hand towel. Dark colors
  are requested by LWR. Lightweight bath towels are easier for recipients to handwash
  and air dry, take less storage space, and are less expensive than the fluffy towels we
  might enjoy.
- 1 toothbrush, in its original wrapping\*\*
- · 1 wide-toothed comb (not a pocket comb) and
- 1 metal nail clipper (for fingernails OR toenails), with or without a nail file attached.
   We CANNOT use emery boards.

\*\*we can accept multi-packs of toothbrushes. They will be opened and individual toothbrushes placed in a sealed business-size envelope at the time of kit assembly.

We ask that you bring in the items for a complete kit if you can. However, we'll make up kits if you want to focus on only a certain item or items. There is a collection bin in the church entryway. We will also accept cash/check gifts with PCK in the memo line. Make the check out to Living Water Lutheran Church.

Once again we've requested financial support from a \$250 Thrivent Action Team Grant to help us fill out needed items. Last year, through your generosity and the help from Thrivent, we were able to assemble 125 Personal Care Kits. Can we do it again? Thank you for your support! 

# Region 2 Synod 2024 Lenten Challenge



This year for Lent, the five synods in Region 2 are challenging one another to raise money for ELCA World Hunger.

The challenge is to pledge to participate in some spiritual and physical practices during Lent and raise some money for ELCA World Hunger. Bragging rights goes to the synod with the most individual participants.

Why Lent? Lent is 40 days to reflect, remember our dependence on God and one another, and look forward to the ways God calls us to be. Adding one or more of these small practices to your observation of Lent might help you feel more connected. A light-hearted challenge like this might help our synods be the Church together, and to see God's vision and invitation for us to be a church for the world and share the good news of Jesus Christ.

What are the 40-40-40 Lenten practices?

To participate you'll pledge to do 3 of the 4 (or all 4) practices for Lent.

- Daily Devotion. Subscribe to receive daily email devotions for Lent. These short reflections will be delivered right to your inbox every morning for Lent.
- Daily Discipline. Do one wellness activity every day. Maybe it's your daily workout, maybe is a 1-mile walk a day. Maybe it's taking an extra flight of stairs or an extra glass of water.
- Daily Donation. Pledge to give \$1 a day (or more) to ELCA World Hunger for the 40 days of Lent.
- Daily Declutter. Once a day find, a way to daily declutter, de-stress, and re-tune. It could be clearing out the garage, your calendar, or a desk or drawer and donating gently used items.

How is this a challenge? This a friendly competition for a good cause. In honor of 50 years of ELCA World Hunger, our goal is for individuals representing 50 congregations per synod to participate.

What does our synod win? The 'winning' bishop will play a short video with congratulatory clips recorded by the other participating bishops. This acknowledgement of the 'superiority' by the other synods for this one challenge is all in fun.
