### A Message from Pastor Shari

### Lent: An invitation to experience spiritual renewal

"Child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever." It is at baptism where it all begins, when we set out on our journey as a Christian in this world. And, it is the symbol of the cross that we carry on our foreheads throughout that journey, everywhere we go.

On Ash Wednesday, we are marked...once again, with that same cross, but this time it is made upon us with ashes. In this act, we are invited to reflect on anything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor, and we are reminded that we are dust and to dust we shall return. This is where the meaningful discipline of Lent begins every year.

This year, I encourage you to experience Lent in a new, and transforming way, and consider adding some of the traditional practices (with a new perspective) listed below to your 40-day journey. For it is through the discipline of Lent, we can find spiritual renewal, freedom and grace.

### **Spiritual Practices:**

- Repentance: Remember your Baptism each day when you rise and before you retire by placing a small bowl of water in your bedroom, dipping your fingers in it and making the sign of the cross while saying the Invocation: "In the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit."
- Prayer: We are drawn closer to God in contemplation and communication. Prayer is our half of a conversation with God. That means that prayer is not only speaking, but listening as well.
- Fasting: This does not necessarily mean giving up all food for a day.
   More frequently it is the giving up or limiting of a particular food or food group (sweets, desserts, chocolate, butter, fat, eggs, etc.).
- Works of Love: The intention of this part of the Lenten Discipline is to connect our faith in God's love for us with actions that are loving of others in the world.

As you begin this Lenten discipline, I invite you to begin with prayer, asking the Holy Spirit for guidance in choosing those things that would best fit you for your Lenten Discipline. Prayerfully dedicate all your choices to God as a commitment for the 40 days of Lent, and ask that your Lenten Discipline move you closer to God and bring you spiritual renewal. And, may your journey bring you to a glorious Easter morning in which we long to hear, "He is Risen!"

### Living Water's office fish wishes he could attend the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans this July

Q. The Ladies Tea fundraiser was delightful. It piqued my interest in the Youth Gathering. What can you tell me about this event?

A. Lutheran youth have been coming together for more than 100 years. The first ELCA Youth Gathering was in San Antonio in 1988 (the year three Lutheran denominations merged to form the ELCA). Since then, there's been a Gathering every third year with one exception when it was cancelled due to COVID in 2021.

The ELCA describes the Gathering as follows: "Every three years, thousands of high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a time of faith formation. Through days spent in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service, and fellowship, young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives."

The 2024 Gathering's theme is "Created to Be." This youth faith formation mission has five goals: (1) affirmed and challenged in their faith, (2) experience new perspectives, (3) ponder their vocation, (4) bond with their congregational group, and (5) learn more about the ELCA and our partners. These goals will be achieved as young people converge together for music, speakers, and worship and as they engage in other activities, including God's work already being done in New Orleans and nightly congregational devotions and briefings.

Living Water's six participants are using the Gathering's 10-lesson curriculum to prepare for their trip. To pay for it, they're involved in fundraisers, including this month's Moonlight and Music event. Pastor Shari has also obtained a generous grant from the Grand Canyon Synod. Additionally, each participant contributes \$400 to help cover expenses.

Experiences like the ELCA Youth Gathering can be life changing. When Pastor Shari attended the Gathering in Dallas in 1991, she "was blown away with the speakers. They inspired me to see the world and my faith in a new and beautiful light."


The Healing Service on January 24 provided a moment to share the Light of Christ. Hopefully, another service will be scheduled in the future.


