### A Message from Pastor Mark

It is different here in the desert because it is not so obvious to us is the fact that April is the time of new birth. In the upper Midwest and in the East people celebrate the warming of the days, the budding of the trees, the greening of the grass. Here those changes are far more subtle, but we see the addition of colors that temporarily brighten the desert landscape. April is when we see the birth of the infants throughout the animal world. April has also been a time when a great many folks made an impact in this world. Many of these "April People" have made significant strides in changing and enhancing the world.

Albrecht Duerer was an artist born in 1471. .Michaelangelo Buonarroti was also an artist, but he was born in 1475. Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a pastor and a theologian who was born in 1906. Mikael Agricola was the Bishop of Turku in Finland and he was born somewhere between 1508 and 1512. Olavus Petri was a priest who was born in 1493, his brother Laurentius was also a priest, and he was born in 1499. Anselm was the Archbishop of Canterbury, and he was born in 1009. Toyohiko Kagawa was born in 1888 and he began the Kingdom of God movement in Japan. Catherine of Siena was a teacher. She was born somewhere around 1347.

The one thing that ties all of these folks together is found in the fact that they are all commemorated by the church during the month of April. These "April People" have been set aside in this manner because there was something about the actions of their lives that made a difference in the world. Usually, it was a difference that was considered fairly significant.

The big deal in the Christian world for the month of April is the continued celebration of the Easter Resurrection throughout the season of Easter. That is the one BIG thing that makes us Christians, well, Christian. It is the Christ event. It is the day that changed the world forever. It is also the day that changed the lives of those previously mentioned people too.

There is one thing that is almost of equal value to the resurrection. It is what we do with it. In the resurrection we have been given the single greatest gift God could have given us. Our lives are ones in which we are called and challenged to live them out in a way that exhibits the love that God has shared with us.

These April people shaped their lives in a way that allowed them to share with the world the love that God gave to them. In a manner as unique and individual as they were, they sought out special ways to serve the God of love and life. They were able to take their talents, their gifts, their personalities, their very selves and use them to better the world in the name of Christ.

For us, Easter is nothing unless we make it something. That does not mean that we have any power over the gift God gave the world in the life, death, and resurrection of his Son. What it does mean is that if we do not live our lives in a manner that is befitting of this gift, if we do not seek out ways to share our lives in the name of Christ and through the love of Christ, then Easter has been useless. It is not that Easter is useless to us, but we are useless to the Easter event. We are called to live our lives in the name of Christ, seeking out new ways to serve Him. What we do may never be good enough to get our names recorded into a book and assigned a date, but what really matters is that which we do is good enough for God – an honor to God. Good enough to offer glory and honor to God is really what we are to be all about. For the honor and glory of God is what being an April Person is all about – it is how an Easter person lives life.

#### Living Water's office fish encourages you to take a look at the Annual Report

Q. When my previous church held its Annual Meeting it provided a printed Annual Report. I didn't see any Annual Reports for Living Water's Annual Meeting in February. Did I miss something?

A. Like most churches, every year LWLC produces an Annual Report and makes it available to members of the congregation. If you'd been here a few years ago, you would've seen a stack of reports in the Narthex the day of the Annual Meeting.

The 2019 report was the last time bound copies were available. Not long after its release in February of 2020, COVID-19 prompted a "sanctuary shutdown." As the pandemic surged, the congregation initially worshiped online on Sunday mornings. Later on, we had a second option: worshiping in-person on the church lawn. Instead of distributing paper worship bulletins, LWLC made the Sunday bulletin available to everyone by posting it on the church website prior to worship. That shift, which also helps conserve trees, didn't end there. When 2021 rolled around, LWLC decided to forgo bound copies of the 2020 Annual Report. Instead, the somewhat lengthy document was available on the church website.

Our congregation's 2023 Annual Report is chock full of information. In addition to statistics about church membership, the names of new members, and other details, it includes interesting and informative reports by Pastor Mark, Pastor Shari, and Council President Darnell Pettengill. The bulk of the report consists of descriptions of the activities and accomplishments of LWLC's 60-plus ministry teams in 2023. (See page 32 for an up-to-date listing of Mission Program Groups and their leaders.) As you browse through the report, you'll be amazed by all that goes on at LWLC.

#### Church Council Highlights March 2024



What: Eucharistic Ministers are members of our congregation who share God's gift of communion and visitation with those who are unable to attend our worship service.


Who: Anyone who feels a calling to this ministry and completes the training is welcome to join.
