A Message from Pastor Mark

ROY G. BIV. Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Indigo and Violet. The colors of the light spectrum. If I remember correctly when you put all those colors together you get black and an absence of all those colors produces white light. It seems to me that within that light spectrum indigo really gets the short end of the stick. In fact, I am pretty sure that I didn't even know indigo was a color until I was taught the spectrum. While I was not aware of indigo, it is still an equal part of the light spectrum and just as important and integral as any of the other colors. Indigo matters.

Have you ever yawned for the sole reason that a person you are with yawned first? It is known as an empathetic response. Feeling and experiencing what the other is feeling. Such responses are important within our community. It is that type of response that moves an individual beyond the realm of merely tolerating another person and places them in a setting where they might be willing to actually walk a bit in their shoes. Empathy is really about attempting to understand the life through the eyes of another. It is not an easy thing to do.

As the political and social rancor of this country grows to unheard of proportions, it seems that what is dissipating is the level of personal empathy. Individually we seem less and less willing to take that walk in the shoes of another, to try to experience life from their perspective, to trying to understand what it feels like to be them in this world.

When the group Black Live Matters is mentioned there are more than a few upper middle class white folks who begin to froth at the mouth and contort themselves like Linda Blair in the movie the Exorcist. For instead of trying to understand what might be behind all of it, there is a knee jerk reaction that takes place.

And it is not just that one group. Our world has become inundated with words and phrases that create confusion, anger and indignation. And yet they are just words. Words such as border, immigrant, refugee, progressive, right wing, radical, woke, pundit, blue state, red state and so many more. The power we have given to these words has created chaos, separation and hostility. But despite what you may here from politicians, this is not the world God desires for us.

The world that God has created for us is a world not of barriers, walls, and separation, but one of bridges and conversations – a world where we are solely defined by our humanity and our faith.

Galatians 3.28: There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus.

Despite what we hear and see of others in the world around us, we are called to be people of faith. It is that faith which binds us, it is that faith which guides us. And most importantly in these troubled times, it is that faith which calls us to heal, to bind wounds and to love – to love above all else. For as Christ taught,

Luke 10.27: 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself.'

For when we live out of the love of Christ, then we better understand that all colors matter, all people matter, and it is that love which we share that matters the most.

Living Water's 24/7 office fish applauds the VBS Book Drive Mission Project's impact on children in need

O. How many new or gently used books were donated during VBS this year?

A. Thanks to the efforts of Ima Bookworm and many other folks, a total of 2,862 books were received during VBS. Donors included VBS participants and their families, LWLC members, and people from an ELCA church that is part of the Northeast Valley Consortium. The book drive also received monetary donations: a generous \$250 grant from Thrivent and \$120 from anonymous donors. Within a month, that \$370 was used to procure an additional 1,699 new and gently used books. In total, the VBS Book Drive netted 4,561 books for distribution, primarily to children in need. That's a lot of reading material!

LWLC's point person for allocating all the books explained that "Assistance League of Phoenix is honored to handle the distribution of books from this drive to area children in need. After volunteers put LWLC and ALP logos on bookplates in every title and sorted quantities into grade-leveled boxes, 861 books were picked up by NourishPHX (the food and clothing bank also served by our Angel Tree, etc.). Remaining quantities are headed to UMOM Chapel, NOAH clinics, Head Start locations, unwed mothers, and Title I schools."

The boatload of books collected during the VBS Book Drive will have an important impact on the children who receive them. According to The National Children's Book and Literacy Alliance, "books help kids develop basic language skills and profoundly expand their vocabularies — much more than any other media. Books let kids try on the world before they have to go out into it. Book give us the tools to achieve our dreams." Having access to books helps a child in multiple ways: thinking skills, writing skills, listening skills, memory, concentration, cognitive development, imagination, creativity, empathy, parents-child bonding, and the joy of reading.

Back to School Blessing


All Students, Teachers and Staff who are soon going back to school are invited for a special blessing to begin the new school year surrounded in prayer.



Here is what is needed to fill each backpack. Feel free to donate any quantity of any of these items. Please do not donate anything other than what is on the list below:

Four - 70 sheet notebooks (wide or college ruled paper) No loose-leaf paper.

One - 30-centimeter ruler (or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other)

One - Pencil sharpener

One - Pair blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

Five - Unsharpened number 2 pencils with erasers. Secure with rubber band

Five - Black or blue ballpoint pends (no gel ink) Secure with rubber band.

One-Box of 16 or 24 crayons

One -2 1/2 inch eraser
