## A Message from Pastor Shari

On November 10, there will be nine students affirming their baptisms at Living Water. November may seem far away, but for these students, right now is the time in their confirmation journey when they are working on important tasks to prepare them for this day. Many requirements are already complete, such as classes, service hours, and worship notes; but in the next couple of months they be working on their faith papers, creating a stole to wear on confirmation day, picking a favorite bible verse, and preparing for a meeting with me. And, as each meeting comes to a close, I will ask them: Would you like to affirm your baptism?

I think this is an important question, because when they were brought to the baptismal font as infants, toddlers or even young kids; they did not really know what baptism really meant, so parents or guardians spoke on behalf of them. But, after some life experience, learning more about the church, faith, and attending confirmation classes, they have a better understanding of what it is all about.

Ultimately, when they come before the congregation on November 10, they will be asked to profess their faith in the trinity: God, Jesus and Holy Spirit, and this is how it will go:

Pastor: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Pastor: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Pastor: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Pastor: Do you believe in God the Father?

Pastor: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

Pastor: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

Pastor: Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Maybe you remember doing this as a teenager. Or, maybe you never had the opportunity to participate in confirmation class. Whatever your experience may be, these are important questions to continue to ponder ourselves as we continue a faith journey that always has room to change and grow. These questions are also important as we consider how we will interact with the world around us, and all the challenges we face every day. They are not ancient, nor are they not applicable to our life today. God has made a covenant with us that will not be broken. However, our promises to God must be nurtured if we are to live out God's calling for our lives.

Q. A statement on the back of CONNECTIONS describes Living Water as "a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, Grand Canyon Synod, and Northeast Valley Conference." What does all this mean?

A. For a start, it signifies our membership in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), one of the largest Christian denominations nationwide. This body is united by "living, daring confidence in God's grace" as set forth by Martin Luther. "We believe God's grace, God's unfathomable love, is available to all people as a gift through Jesus Christ. All are welcome here."

The ELCA is the larges Lutheran body in the country. It has nearly 3.3 million members in more than 8,900 worship communities across the country and in the Caribbean. The church-wide organization, which is based out of the Lutheran Center in Chicago, works along with several organization. They include 7 seminaries, 27 colleges and universities related to the ELCA, campus ministries, 2,000+ early childhood education centers, social service agencies, and other agencies and institutions in the U.S. and around the world. The Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton currently serves as presiding bishop.

Every congregation belongs to one of the ELCA's 65 synods. The smallest synod has 30 worship communities, and the largest one has nearly 300 congregations. A synod's role is to unite the work of congregations, provide regional support, and guide staff placement for pastors and other candidates. Living Water is in the Grand Canyon Synod, which has close to 90 congregations. Each synod has a bishop; ours is the Rev. Deborah K. Hutterer, who was re-elected in June to serve a six-year term. This Phoenix-based synod encompasses Arizona as well as churches in four Nevada counties and a congregation in St. George, Utah.

The Northeast Valley Conference is one of eight geographical groupings our synod established to foster relationships among congregations for missional purposes. The conference consists of Living Water and seven other congregations in Scottsdale and nearby communities. Pastor Mark currently serves as this conference's dean.

Andrea founded Restore in 2017 out of her own need for a night of refreshment and encouragement in her role as a mom.






#### Noelle Rhodes

Here is what is needed to fill each backpack. Feel free to donate any quantity of any of these items. Please do not donate anything other than what is on the list below:

Four - 70 sheet notebooks (wide or college ruled paper) No loose-leaf paper.

One - 30-centimeter ruler (or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other)

One - Pencil sharpener

One - Pair blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

Five - Unsharpened number 2 pencils with erasers. Secure with rubber band

Five - Black or blue ballpoint pends (no gel ink) Secure with rubber band.



## Tuesday Women's Bible Study Returns

Join us beginning Tuesday, Sept. 10, when we resume our regular Tuesday morning in-person and virtual Zoom connection Bible study at 10 am in the Fellowship Hall. We will begin with the 3-session study on After Certainty from the Gather magazine summer issues, May/June and July/August. This study was written by ELCA pastor and now Bishop of the Rocky Mountain Synod, Rev. Dr. Meghan Johnston Aelabouni. Drawing from Biblical texts and Lutheran tradition, we'll ponder what it means to live faithfully in times of uncertainty. And we'll see how God leads us beyond certainty to curiosity, community and compassion. Study material will be provided if you don't have your copies of the Gather magazine. (This is the



study we attempted to do at Spirit in the Desert Retreat Center on July 23 before Myrna got delayed trying to get out of New Orleans after the Youth Gathering!)



Then, beginning on October 1, we are going to return to a favorite New Testament scholar, N.T. Wright, to take a deep dive into the Gospel of Matthew. This material will nearly fill up our schedule until Spring of 2025. We'll look at the structure and artistry of Matthew, how Matthew presents Jesus as God with us, authoritative over heaven and earth.

We'll trace themes of Jesus' authority throughout the Gospel, consider how to apply the new way of life as Jesus describes it, and discover faith as the appropriate human response to Jesus' message.

Both studies include some video, and we always include some meditative music and prayer. You don't need to purchase any material. Just bring your favorite Bible translation and connect with us for about 90 minutes each Tuesday morning. Coffee and hot water for tea/hot chocolate are provided. Occasionally we also have a treat!
