

A Message from Pastor Shari

All Saints Day is a wonderful day to remember our dearly departed loved ones. They walked with us along our journey, and impacted our lives in very special ways. They were our grandparents, our parents, our friends, siblings and family members. Some were our spouses, and some were even our children. They were old, middle-age, and young. But, they were so much more than that. They were saints. And, they will not be forgotten.

I often think about the dearly departed saints in the churches that I have served as a pastor. Amazing people who touched so many lives. They all were special and one-of-a-kind people that spread joy when they were serving God's people through the work of the church. I'm sure many of them never would have thought they would be called "saints" after they had died, but I think it's a perfect word to describe them. They weren't perfect, in fact, sometimes we annoyed each other. But they found their calling and pursued it to the fullest, and found so much joy in serving with the gifts they had been given.

Martin Luther and Saint Paul agreed that we do not have to die to become saints. That, in fact, all who have been sanctified through Christ are saints, which is all of us! And, at the same time, we are all sinners. We have the potential to do good, and the potential to do bad.

As we think about the decisions we make, the ways in which we spend our time, and how we nurture our relationships, I think it is very helpful to remember how other saints have touched our lives. We might want to think about what stands out in our memories when we think of them. Was it their joy or passion? Was it their loyalty and commitment to loving us no matter what? Whatever it was, it was their own unique way of living out their sanctification through Christ. Living Water's 24/7 office fish explains PACE's mission and vision

Q. Occasionally I see or hear a reference to something called PACE. What is it?

A. Pro-Active Community Engagement (PACE) is a ministry team formed in 2017. Its mission is to promote awareness of LWLC as a community resource, and as a welcoming center of Christian faith, fellowship, and service. This ministry team's vision for PACE is to attract new people to LWLC by planning activities and initiatives that engage our neighbors and enable our members to become ambassadors of outreach.

The PACE team has undertaken a variety of projects. One of its first pursuits was designing bright blue LWLC tote bags. Church members can use these eye-catching bags for shopping. They're also perfect for LWLC Service Mission Group activities, such as the distribution of food around Thanksgiving and Angel Tree gifts for children around Christmas.

PACE also organizes events that are open to the community. For example, it occasionally recruits speakers to come to our campus. Its first such event was a well-attended gathering that featured Pro Golfer Tom Lehman. A year or so later, Dr. David Williams of ASU presented an out-of-this-world program: "NASA's Exploration of Our Solar System." PACE recently sponsored "Aging and Transitioning," an informative presentation by Mari Murrin, who shared her wide-ranging knowledge about senior care options.

Pet festivals are one of PACE's favorite and popular events. The first of its three family-friendly festivals included the blessing of all sorts of animals. It also featured a friendly camel named Elvis and a riveting Scottsdale K-9 unit demonstration. The most recent festival was in 2022. Along with blessing animals and a K-9 encore, it included a dog agility course and photo-ops with Ben the Clydesdale. Stay tune for the next festival!

While pet festivals are great fun, PACE's most important activity is serving as a blood drive site for the Red Cross. Providing space for much-needed blood donations is truly a godsend.





Exploring Methodist and Lutheran Traditions


Saturday, November 9th, from 9:30-11:30am - Hot brunch will be served. North Scottsdale United Methodist Church, Fellowship Hall
