A Message from Pastor Shari

Thank you so much for your support of the upcoming Youth Mission Trip this summer. I want you to know that you are truly making a difference in the lives of the young people (Ryan Handley, Allison Handley, Summer Weisman, Shaina Weisman, and Brooke Bates) who will be going to Lake Traverse, South Dakota from July 8-13.

For young people in our world, there are so many things competing for their attention.

However, when they dedicate one week out of the year to focus on serving others in the name of Christ, it can positively impact their self-



esteem and confidence. Not only do they get their hands dirty and work hard to make a difference, but they also have time for self-reflection to see how they may be capable of so much more than they ever imagined. And, through the encouragement of the mission trip leaders and meaningful conversations with other Christians, they can envision themselves as an important part of God's kingdom.

These trips also offer opportunities for young people to get out of their comfort zones. We sleep on church floors, eat simple food, take quick showers in locker rooms, and live and worship in a close-knit community of young Christians from all over the country. It is a completely different life than what our kids are used to. In addition to that, in each service opportunity, we are exposed to people who are in need, and we learn their stories and get to know them personally. Also, we get to know some of the people who dedicate their lives and gifts to serving in non-profit organizations or ministries. These opportunities and relationships open our eyes to new and grace-filled ways of seeing people around us and the world we live in.

Lastly, and maybe most importantly, Mission Trips connect us with what God is up to all around us. God is doing some amazing things in the world, but often we fail to see those things. When the young people return home, it is our hope that they will be encouraged to participate with God's mission in their own communities and love and value everyone around them.

God's calling for all of us is far more than a trip. But we know, for many, living out that calling begins with a trip. That's why this is so important. Thank you, Living Water!

Living Water's 24/7 office fish explains the bond between two ELCA congregations

Q. What can you tell me about the picture of a church that hangs on the wall near the water fountain? Every time I pass by it, I wonder how Mount Olivet Lutheran Church is connected to Living Water. What's the story?

A. The story involves a young pastor, a matchmaking sister, and Minnesota snowbirds.

In May 1997, while serving at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Phoenix, the Rev. Tim Selbo accepted a call to develop and pastor a new ELCA mission in Scottsdale. Knocking on thousands of doors, he distributed brochures and invited residents to join a new faith community.

Meanwhile, a Prince of Peace member named Nancy Hogan contacted her brother, Paul Youngdahl. He served as senior pastor at Mount Olivet Lutheran Church in Minneapolis. Nancy knew that her brother was interested in supporting a mission congregation in an area frequented by Mount Olivet snowbirds. Her matchmaking led to the two pastors and their wives meeting for dinner.

Pastor Tim recalls, "I think Paul was checking me out (or subtly interviewing me) to see if they would jump in with this new start and this young pastor." Shortly thereafter, Mount Olivet agreed to be a Mission Founder congregation with LWLC. This generous Minnesota congregation supported LWLC by providing people (winter visitors), prayers, financial resources (for five years), and pulpit supply in Pastor Tim's absence. He, in turn, occasionally preached at Mount Olivet and also participated in its other ministries.

This divine partnership gave LWLC a solid start. Near the end of 1997, 81 adults and children gathered on Christmas Eve at the Terravita Activity Center, where Pastor Tim led LWLC's first worship service. A couple years later, our Constitution was adopted on Organizational Sunday (March 26, 2000), and LWLC became fully self-supporting. Charter Membership totaled 150.

This month marks LWLC's 25th anniversary. We'll celebrate this milestone on April 27. Pastor Tim will preach that Sunday morning. In the evening, we'll gather at Troon North Golf Club to celebrate the last 25 years and open the door to new opportunities. (The reservation deadline is March 30.)

Church Council Highlights February 2025



Lenten Challenge for 2025

Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission (NELM) is a 70-year-old ministry of the ELCA in Rock Point, AZ where more than half of the households either do not have running water or do not have access to safe drinking water.

The 2025 Lenten Challenge supports Lutheran Disaster Relief (LDR) and our church's call to respond to nonconventional disasters including the work of NELM. The 5 synods of the ELCA Region 2 are challenging each other to raise funds through LDR in support of water projects at NELM. The synod with the most individual registrations will get bragging rights, so register all household email addresses.

THE CHALLENGE: Participate in some spiritual and physical practices during the 40 days of Lent. Each registrant should commit to 3 of the 4 practices.

The 4 practices include: Daily Devotions, Daily Dedication, Daily, Diligence, and Daily Giving. Participants commit to three (or more!) of the following practices during Lent:

- Daily Devotion Receive daily devotions by Pastor Bill Dohle or use ELCA World Hunger resources.
- **Daily Diligence** Conserve water, learn about water resources, and engage with water in meaningful ways.
- Daily Dedication Participate in community worship, Bible studies, or activities like water walks and World Water Day celebrations.
- Daily Donation Pledge \$1/day (or more) for 40 days to Lutheran Disaster Response, benefiting NELM.

Piecemakers Quilting


Join us on March 5 and 19th
