Q. I always look forward to Living Water's Adult Forum. When will it start up?

A. You'll be happy to know that Living Water's Sunday morning Adult Forum resumes on the first Sunday in October. As usual, it meets in the Choir Room on the second floor of the Education Building and starts at 9:00.

Over the years, Living Water's Sunday morning Adult Forum has featured an array of presentations given by a variety of different people: our pastors, members of the congregation, and outside speakers. Our congregation is fortunate to have several retired pastors worshipping alongside us on Sunday mornings. Many of them have kindly shared their theological knowledge and Biblical understanding with Adult Forum attendees. One of these retired pastors, the Rev. Dennis D. Nelson, will kick off this year's Adult Forum with a two-week study in October followed by a four-week series in November and December.

The October study — "Life Is Hard But God Is Good" — is scheduled for Oct. 6 and 20.

It focuses on the letters that Paul wrote to two young, struggling pastors: Timothy and Titus. As Pastor Dennis explains, "Pau's words to them of encouragement, support, and specific instructions will also help and speak to us as we face the never-ending challenges of life."

The four-part series in November and December is entitled "A Man After God's Own Heart." This study will focus on David. The dates are Nov. 3 and 17 followed by Dec. 1 and 15.

If you're not familiar with this interesting learning opportunity, it's well worth coming to Living Water a little earlier on the Sundays that the Adult Forum meets. Pastor Dennis is a great teacher, and the accompanying slides assembled by his wife Terry add a lot to these presentations. Be sure to set your alarm clock an hour earlier!

Church Council Highlights September 2024

The Church council met on September 16 th to address several continuing and new agenda items.

Our insurance policies are up for renewal shortly. To remain compliant, we have updated our "Child and Youth Protection Policies."

Council member Jim King attended a Congregational Security Webinar. Living Water is up to date on security and emergency medical procedures. Fortunately, there have been no credible security threats in the Valley.

Council approved a \$1,000 contribution to the Grand Canyon Synod Retirees Retreat. Treasurer Steve Umland reported that our year-to-date financial figures remain positive to budget. As always, this is affected by the timing of expenses and contributions.

In the continuing process of keeping the church property updated (which has recently included painting and tree trimming), landscape rock will be added to the parking lot islands and the irrigation system will be fine-tuned.

Living Water will celebrate 25 years as a congregation in the Spring of 2025. In anticipation of this milestone, a planning committee has been formed.





Tuesday Women's Bible Study Returns

Join us beginning Tuesday, Oct. 1, when we resume our regular Tuesday morning in-person and virtual Zoom connection Bible study at 10 am in the Fellowship Hall. We will begin with the 3-session study on *After Certainty* from the Gather magazine summer issues, May/June and July/August. This study was written by ELCA pastor and now Bishop of the Rocky Mountain Synod, Rev. Dr. Meghan Johnston Aelabouni. Drawing from Biblical texts and Lutheran tradition, we'll ponder what it means to live faithfully in times of uncertainty. And we'll see how God leads us beyond certainty to curiosity, community and compassion. Study material will be provided if you don't have your copies of the Gather magazine. (This is the



study we attempted to do at Spirit in the Desert Retreat Center on July 23 before Myrna got delayed trying to get out of New Orleans after the Youth Gathering!)



Then, beginning on October 1, we are going to return to a favorite New Testament scholar, N.T. Wright, to take a deep dive into the Gospel of Matthew. This material will nearly fill up our schedule until Spring of 2025. We'll look at the structure and artistry of Matthew, how Matthew presents Jesus as God with us, authoritative over heaven and earth.

We'll trace themes of Jesus' authority throughout the Gospel, consider how to apply the new way of life as Jesus describes it, and discover faith as the appropriate human response to Jesus' message.

Both studies include some video, and we always include some meditative music and prayer. You don't need to purchase any material. Just bring your favorite Bible translation and connect with us for about 90 minutes each Tuesday morning. Coffee and hot water for tea/hot chocolate are provided. Occasionally we also have a treat! If you aren't on our email distribution list, please contact myrna.ulland@gmail.com to get our Tuesday Women messages. The Zoom link is always provided in advance.
