


Piecemakers Quilters on Summer Break!


Rice, Beans, Flour and Dollars: Support for La Casa de la Misericordia in Nogales, Mexico ends Wednesday, June 4.

On Sunday, May 11, retired pastor Rev. Dr. Adele Resmer extended an invitation to support a shelter (La Casa) in Nogales, Sonora, Mexico, serving vulnerable families. La Casa, is supported by the Grand Canyon Synod (ELCA), the Episcopal Dioceses of Arizona, the UCC District of the Southwest and the Disciples of Christ. Families at La Casa are provided shelter, food, education for children, and job training for adults. All guests at the shelter care for the 5 acre property, working on cleaning, cooking, property care and security teams. Because the guests contribute to the care of the community, only 4 paid staff people are required to provide oversight and care for the shelter. The Director of La Casa is Sister Lika.

We will collect rice, beans and flour through June 4. Pastor Adele will be with us on Sunday, June 8 and will take the items to the shelter. Bring your donated items to the church entryway. Dollars can be contributed, allowing the shelter to purchase these needed items in the local community. Dollars also help offset costs for electricity, fuel and rent. Select an envelop from the narthex for your donation. Make your check payable to Living Water and note 'La Casa' in the memo line. Place your envelope in the offering plate or bring to the church office. You can also donate online through LWLC.

The ELCA congregations of the NE Consortium, of which we are a member, have been generous supporters of La Casa for the last 4 years.
