A Message from Pastor Shari

What is the Northeast Valley Consortium, and what is it up to these days?

The NEVC is a partnership of five ELCA Congregations in our area, and Living Water is one of the congregations that is blessed to be part of this new and creative way of doing ministry. Founded in 2020, it has taken on a variety of different spiritual, educational, and service-oriented programs throughout its first five years, but has remained true to its goals, which are:

Navigate challenges in congregational life
Accomplish more together than we could separately
Grow our understanding of lay-led, clergy-supported ministry
Team driven and organized to address needs in our communities

The people from our congregation who serve on the Steering Team of the Consortium include Pastor Shari Bernau, Debbie Anderson and Lisa Moehn, and this team of about 12 members meets about every 6-8 weeks via zoom.

Recently, we have accomplished some amazing things. Last summer, we partnered up to make 2600 lunches to be distributed to Heat Respite Centers in downtown Phoenix who serve people who are homeless. And, this summer, we are planning to do the same! In fact, Living Water has two dates on the calendar: August 11 and 25. Hope you can join us! More details to come.

In the spring of 2025, we took on the 40-40-40 Lenten Challenge, which was an opportunity to participate in some spiritual and physical practices during the 40 days of Lent, raise awareness of hunger issues, and raise \$30,564 for the Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission, and \$25,961 for disasters such as US Wildfires, Hurricane Response, Middle East Crisis, and Where Needed Most. In addition to raising money for the 40-40-40 Lenten Challenge, our Consortium participated in pew exchanges, a Walk for Water, and a Maundy Thursday worship service at Spirit in the Desert Retreat Center.

Our Consortium also works together to meet the needs of the people staying at La Casa de la Misericordia in Nogales, Mexico. On top of that, we received hundreds of books last year and this year from our partner congregations to help with our Vacation Bible School Mission Project. Together we can do so much more! Together, we are bigger, bolder, and going further than we ever imagined. Who knows where God will lead us next?

Living Water's 24/7 office fish shares LWLC members' devotion options

Q. Hey Zeke, I've been using the same daily devotions for several years. I'd like to try something else. Any suggestions??

- A. I've got oodles of options for you. Five years ago, when COVID arrived and we
 initially had to worship on Zoom, I thought it might be interesting to ask some
 LWLC members what they would recommend. My fishing netted the following
 boatload of responses.
- I use a couple of devotional books. One is Sarah Young's Jesus Always: Embracing
 Joy in His Presence. I like it because it's all about the joy in your life and how your
 choices matter, even when things are a bit unsettled. The second one is God's Little
 Devotional Book for Women. In addition to a daily story relating to a Bible verse, it
 includes a short modern-day version.
- The YouVersion Bible app is on my phone. This app has daily devotions and other articles.
- We like Spirit in the Desert's Daily Devotion because it mostly follows our weekly liturgy and uses current-day issues (spiritinthedesert.org).
- Three that I routinely use arrive as daily emails: Spirit in the Desert's Daily Devotion; Luther Seminary's God Pause, which is tied to the weekly lectionary (luthersem.edu); and Women of the ELCA's Daily Grace, a short-read faith reflection (womenoftheelca.org).
- I read Luther's Morning Blessing (in the Lutheran Study Bible) followed by Julie Rayburn's Be Still and Know: 365 Days of Hope & Encouragement for Women. My evening devotion is Luther's Evening Blessing. I also like Christ in Our Home (you can pick up a free pocket size or large print copy in the narthex).
- I read Richard Rohr's Daily Meditation every morning (cac.org). I also like Sarah Young's Jesus Calling and Karen Casey's Each Day a New Beginning: Daily Meditations for Women.
- God Calling 365-Day Devotional Bible received from an unexpected and unknown houseguests in 1994 – speaks to me. Also, God Calling: By Two Listeners is a fabulous jewel.
- Spirit in the Desert's Touchpoints short online homilies based on biblical stories
 of people in the Old and New Testaments have lots of viewers.






