

A Message from Pastor Shari

Every summer for the last 22 years that I have lived in the Valley of the Sun, I get a case of the "grass is greener." I literally get jealous of the green grass up in the Midwest and in cooler parts of the country. Of course, I also get jealous of their temperate weather, outside activities and simple enjoyment from spending time in the sun.

Now don't get me wrong, I like living in Arizona. It's an amazing state with such diverse landscapes, elevations and climates. The hiking opportunities are endless. Not to mention the rich Native American and Western history. I also really like the lower cost of living and the laid-back atmosphere. But, I can't help but always feel I am somehow missing out on something better during the blazing hot summers here. And, then I think about the Israelites who had left a terrible situation, made a long trek through the wilderness and then started to experience serious discontent.

Although God had miraculously delivered them from slavery from Egypt, their current menu option led them to tears as they longed for the food they had eaten in Egypt. "And the people of Israel also wept again and said, 'Oh that we had meat to eat! We remember the fish we ate in Egypt that cost nothing, the cucumbers, the melons, the leeks, the onions and the garlic'" (Num. 11:4-5). It seems they didn't remember the food was only free in Egypt because they were slaves. The "grass is greener" syndrome blinded them from seeing the goodness of God in leading them out of slavery and providing for their needs in the wilderness.

God's Word gives us a different perspective. In Psalm 90:14, we find a prayer that helps us combat our natural bent to discontent: "Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love that we may rejoice and be glad all our days." So whether we are tempted to think that a different job would make us happier, or a bigger house would solve our space issues, or losing weight would increase our confidence, we can look to the Lord to restore our gratefulness, gratitude and appreciation for where we are, what we have been given, and who we have become.

Living Water's office fish shares the genesis and impact of the Northeast Valley Consortium

Q. I occasionally hear someone mention the Northeast Valley Consortium. What, pray tell, is it?

A. Three years ago the Grand Canyon Synod and the Dean of our conference approached Living Water and three other churches – Christ the Lord (Carefree), New Covenant (Scottsdale), and New Journey (Fountain Hills) – about exploring ways to work together. Recently, the group welcomed a fifth ELCA congregation, Ascension Lutheran (Paradise Valley).

The creation of the Northeast Valley Consortium (NEVC) set the stage for these ELCA congregations to strengthen their relationships and mutually support one another in ministry. The NEVC is specially valuable in terms of offering parishioners more ministry and fellowship opportunities. It also seeks to develop a stronger outreach presence in communities surrounding NEVC churches.

Our pastors believe that joining forces makes us stronger together, particularly when Christian churches are experiencing overall membership and worship attendance declines. Pastor Shari views the NEVC as an opportunity: "I love to think creatively about how we can reach out to more people and be an even stronger body of Christ."

The consortium is a catalyst for sharing multiple gifts and strengths. LWLC, for example, has strong Bible study groups, Children and Youth Ministry (especially VBS), community service, and music and fellowship ministries. Our partners bring to the table strong music ministries, a preschool program, experience in interfaith relations and social ministries, and other assets. The NEVC's mix of resources paves the way for an array of joint endeavors, such as parishioners from other churches gathering at LWLC for presentations by Luther Seminary professors.

The NEVC has established an impressive track record since its formation in 2020. One recent example is our VBS Book Drive Mission Project. LWLC put the word out this year, and our partner congregations donated a boatload of books. 

Living Water's "Hunger Jar"




The large Hunger Jar is in the sanctuary during services, to the right of the water fountain. Offerings placed in the Hunger Jar are typically distributed 50/50 between local and international/global organizations or initiatives.

The Service and Caring Team Ministry at LWLC periodically determines how to distribute offerings to the Hunger Jar. Most recently, we split the 6/30/25 balance of \$ 1,870. We still allocated 50% locally but split it between three local organizations, St. Mary's Food Bank of Arizona and ELCA, Nourish Phx and Foothills Foodbank. Each received \$312. The 50% for the international portion was split between Lutheran World Hunger and Save My Starving Children. Each received \$467.

You are invited to make an offering to the Hunger Jar while the offering is being collected during the worship service. While the jar's tag line says, "Change for Change," your offering can be coins, bills, and even checks. And, if you prefer, you can donate through LWLC's online donation option and indicate "Hunger Jar."

From time to time, you may also see smaller Hunger Jar collection jars elsewhere in the church as we gather for worship. Each offering placed in the Hunger Jar is a reminder that our hungry neighbors, near and far, benefit from our generosity. Thank you!
