Soup Suppers will be held prior to Bible Study and Lenten Worship on



PETER: FAITHFUL BUT FLAWED DISCIPLE

Five-week study on the life of Peter led by Pastor Dennis D. Nelson

Wednesday evenings during Lent after Ash Wednesday
Between the Soup Supper and the Holden Evening Prayer

March 11 – Solid Rock or Stumbling Block?

March 18 – “I Will Not Deny You”

March 25 – From Cowardice to Courage

Why did all four Gospel writers include the account of the greatest failure of Peter's life – the collapse of his courage and denial of his Lord? I believe that they told this story because Peter himself told this story over and over again. Peter and the Gospel writers wanted us to see that we all, like Peter, have denied Jesus. We all have lived in ways that are inconsistent with our pledge to follow Jesus. We all have had moments when our witness or example was needed, but we remained silent and did nothing. Peter's story shows us that we do not need to be defined by our failures. God does not look at us in terms of the worst thing we have ever done. Jesus uses flawed disciples. And sometimes He uses us even more profoundly, not merely in spite of our flaws and failures but because of them.

BLOOD DRIVE RESULTS

Living Water hosted our quarterly Red Cross blood drive on February 25th. 26 donors gave 30 units of blood! This was a wonderful result. Thank you to all who donated or attempted to do so!

Many of our donors live in the surrounding community and are beginning to count on our location. This is what the Red Cross was hoping would happen.

There is always a critical need for blood. Our next blood drive will be Thursday, May 21st.


Medical Lending Library Ministry





LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF (LWR) PERSONAL CARE KITS COLLECTION DURING LENT

It's that time again! Living Water's annual drive to collect items to fill Personal Care Kits for LWR. The list of items needed for each kit is below.

ONE light-weight bath-size towel, dark color recommended. Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use. Bath towels vary in size. The **52" X 27"** size is the maximum size. 20" x 40" is a good guideline for a minimum size.

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping.

ONE adult-size toothbrush in original packaging*

ONE sturdy comb, wide-toothed preferred. Remove packaging. NO pocket combs or picks.

ONE metal nail clippers (attached file is optional), remove packaging.

Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name. Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.

All items should be new and in good condition.

*toothbrush multi-packs may be used; we seal them in a business-sized envelope during the kit making process

Collection bin is in the church entryway throughout the weeks of Lent until Palm Sunday (March 29). Bring in a full kit, or any components. We will shop for any items needed, using a Thrivent Action Team grant as well as any money donations directed to "Personal Care Kits." 
